
The Creation of the Black History Bulletin

In 1937, Dr. Carter G. Woodson created the BHB at the request of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, ASALH board member and founder of Bethune-Cookman University. Woodson and Bethune collaborated to create a publication that would serve the needs of teachers and general readers.
