He founded The Journal of Negro History in 1916

The Associated Publishers in 1921

He purchased 1538 Ninth Street NW, Washington, DC in 1922

That has now been designated the Woodson Historic Site

The 389th Unit of the National Park System

AT WOODSON'S HOME Negro History Week in 1926 now celebrated as Black History Month

Was born there

The Black History Bulletin in 1937

Was born there

The model for all heritage Holidays in the U.S.

Was born there

The first trained scholars/historians for the field of African American History and Culture
