The National Park Service seeks a dynamic self-motivated individual to serve as Midwest Region Manager for the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom (NTF) program based in Omaha, Nebraska. Qualified candidates will have knowledge of African American history, experience working with communities, developing interpretive materials, and familiarity with historic preservation practices.

The Network to Freedom (NTF) program was established to commemorate and honor the Underground Railroad as a crucial component in the evolution of the Civil Rights movement. Our mission is to honor, preserve, and promote the history of resistance to enslavement through escape and flight. We do this by educating the public about these events and maintaining a network of historic places and programs that represent and interpret this history.

Regional Program Managers are key to our success. Duties of this position include:

- Identifying places and programs that may be eligible for membership in the NTF.
- Assisting property owners, organizations, and communities with preparing applications to become members in the NTF.
- Providing outreach and technical assistance to historic properties
- Sharing educational opportunities with NTF members and the public
- Coordinating and participating in presentations, conferences, and panel discussions
