National Heritage Sites Research Committee Task Agreement (TA) Updates

In September 2022, RFPs were released for the following new Task Agreements and the status of each is provided below:

- Scholar/Consultant Historian
 - Received six applicants; Interviews for two selected applicants scheduled Wednesday, November 16, 2022
- Request for Proposals, Historic Resource Study of Civil War and Reconstruction on African Americans at Monocacy Junction
 - o Received three applicants; NHSRC review in process
- Request for Addendum for African American History of First State National Historical Park
 - o No applicants received; Resending RFP through ASALH network.

Seeking Peer Reviewers for several projects by deadlines noted in red below; TA Updates also provided where needed:

- DeSoto National Monument Africans in the DeSoto Expedition February 2023
 - Subcontractor David Wheat completed his research. Co-Chairs have met with PI,
 Jane Landers, who is in currently in the process of writing the draft report.
 - A change in the NPS Superintendent has taken place. Co-Chairs have met with the new Superintendent.
- Valley Forge Historic Resource Study for African American Participation in the Valley Forge Encampment, 1777 1778 Currently under Peer Review
 - A hybrid *Transfer of Knowledge* presentation took place on October 20, 2022.
 Event was well attended. Research gathered and presented by PI exceeded NPS' expectations. Audience engagement was exceptional. If you missed attending this event, a link will be available for future viewing.
- Seneca Quarry Historic Resource Study of the African American History of the Seneca Quarry Stone Cutting Mill – February 2023
 - o Expect PIs first deliverable week of November 14, 2022.
- A Historic Context Study of African and African Americans in South Florida March 2023

- PIs have conducted two visits to the site and are in the process of writing a draft report; met with Co-Chairs on three occasions to provide updates.
- Visual Anthropology of the Statue of Liberty within the African American Community – December 2023
 - o The PI on this project became ill and recently resigned from the project. Her final report is expected by December 15, 2022.
 - The PIs research assistant, who is based in New York, has agreed to remain on the project.
 - o Co-Chairs have met with the Superintendent at the NPS Site and two candidates for the project have been identified for interview.
- Martin VanBuren Historic Site: A Special History Study of Free and Enslaved Africans at Lindenwald [VanBuren's home in upstate New York February 2023
 - o First Draft submitted by PI. Discovery by PI has been extensive and has provided insight for the Region and direction for the archeological team.
- Booker T. Washington National Monument National Register Nomination Update -February 2023

Recently Completed Projects (visit July 2022 Report for review of all TAs)

Buffalo Soldiers [83,270]

The peer review process for this TA is completed. The peer reviewed final draft document has been submitted for the final review by NPS.

<u>CAWO [Carter Woodson Home] Place-based Curriculum and Kiamsha Peer-to-Peer Historical Youth Scholars Docent Documentary Project</u> [\$164,764]

This project has been a huge success—two summer programs (2020 and 2021) and a 2022 summer field trip to Atlanta, Birmingham, Selma and Montgomery with a contingency of 31 (21 youth (9 Kiamsha and 12 Dunbar); 4 Dunbar and three Kiamsha Chaperones; three NPS representatives) was accomplished. ASALH Historians met the youth at each location to further enhance the historical value of the field trip. A trailer to depict the overall program is being produced by an NPS representatives and will be premiered during the Luncheon Festival in 2023. Final report was submitted in October 2023.

A new co-hort will be funded by NPF beginning Summer of 2023 to replicate and expand the project.
